ELECTRIC VEHICLE RETURN

Utility Fleet magazine, February 2000 reports that Baker Electromotive has a contract to produce 500 electric vehicles for daily mail delivery by the U.S. Post Office. The contract has an option to produce an additional 5,500 vehicles. This is reported to be the largest order for electric vehicles in United States History

The vehicle will consist of a Ford Ranger chassis modified for an electric drive train powered by convential lead-acid batteries. A Grumma van body will be fitted to the chassis.

Baker Electromotive corporation does not have derivation from the Baker Electric Car and Truck Company of the past. However, the present company has its origin in a company that established in 1919


