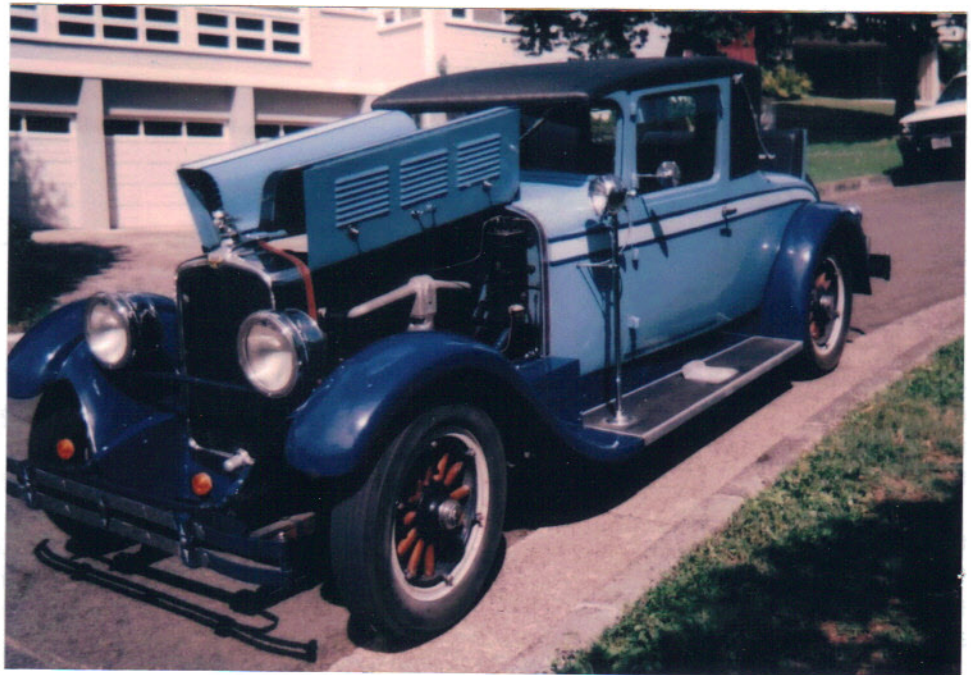
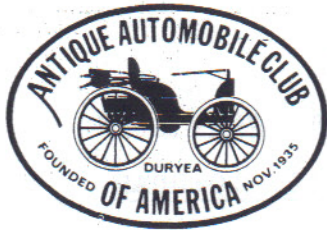

## FEATURE STORY, 1927 Stutz

This 1927 Stutz attend the meet at Richard Morgan's two years ago. When the name Stutz is mentioned the famous Stutz Bear Cat comes to mind. The Bear Cat was an earlier Stutz sports car that set speed records and won races.

Luxury cars were the established line of the company, Spanning models and prices that ranged to compete with Buick, Cadillac and other high priced cars.

Stutz had safety features ahead of most cars, four wheel hydraulic brakes, railroad safety glass, thin wires embeded in the glass to reduce shattering, and a lower center of gravity than most cars of the time.

High performance engines featured overhead camshafts. The subject car has a fashionable styling feature known as the French top. The roof flows in a graceful curve to extend over the windshield to form a sunvisor. Landau bars just past the side windows, rain visors above the side windows, a pedestal spot light, running board step plates, a rumble seat, and a convenient battery box emerging from the lower section of the driver's side fender. Wow, what an exciting car!

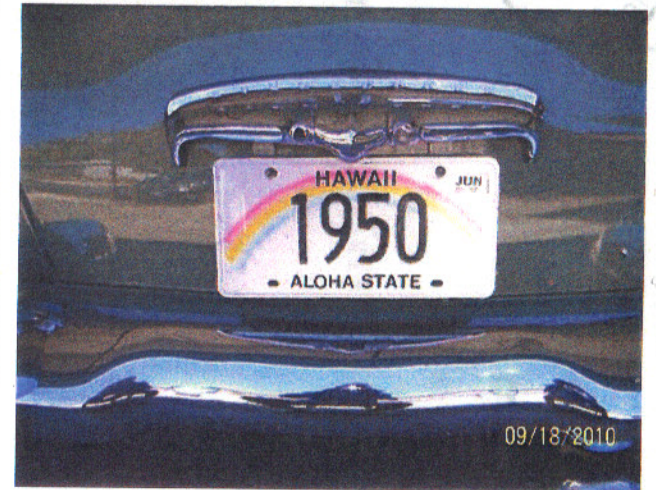
