FEATURE STORY: 1926 Hispano-Suiza

The 1926 Hispano-Suiza model H6B belongs to member Jud Ihrig. Jud has owned this car for decades, having bought it in England. The car was recently shipped back to Hawaii from California where it underwent several years restoration. A new engine block was cast in France. In the photo the front fenders have not yet been mounted.

This model was so successful and advanced that it was built from 1919 to 1938 with few changes. It was a sensation when introduced at the 1919 Paris automobile show. It is an international car, the design is Swiss, the engine was made in France, and the body is English, built by Wayman. It is a padded fabric over wood framing. Wayman was known for custom building such bodies that were squeek-free and beautiful styling.

The engine is 402 cubic inches, six cylinder inline with a non-detachable head and overhead cam. This is a high performance engine which provides thrilling acceleration and speed.

It is equipped with four wheel servo assisted (power) brakes. A servo power take-off from the transmission is linked to the brake mechanism. This was a Hispano-Suiza patented design. The system was so good that

Hispano-Suiza continued:

Rolls Royce paid royalties to use the brake system in their own cars.

Hispano-Suiza built airplane engines for World War I. Some of the airplane engine technology was carried over to this automobile engine.

Owner, Jud Ihrig, back to the camera in the front page photo, Harley Neff opening the back door. Hispano was in the price range of Rolls Royce.



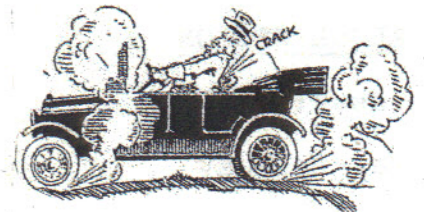
Driver's Cockpit

The dashboard and instrument panel are so beautiful that they deserve their own photo. Airplane-like instruments placed in a black metal surround mated to a natural finished wood panel.

Above the dash is a screw mechanism to swing out the windshield for more ventilation. The car is right hand drive with both the shift lever and emergency brake gated. Below the dash on the interior firewall is an elegant fuse box with a glass window. To the left of the fuse box is the factory installed exhaust cut-out. Seats are upholstered in leather. Oh.....it all just takes your breath away.

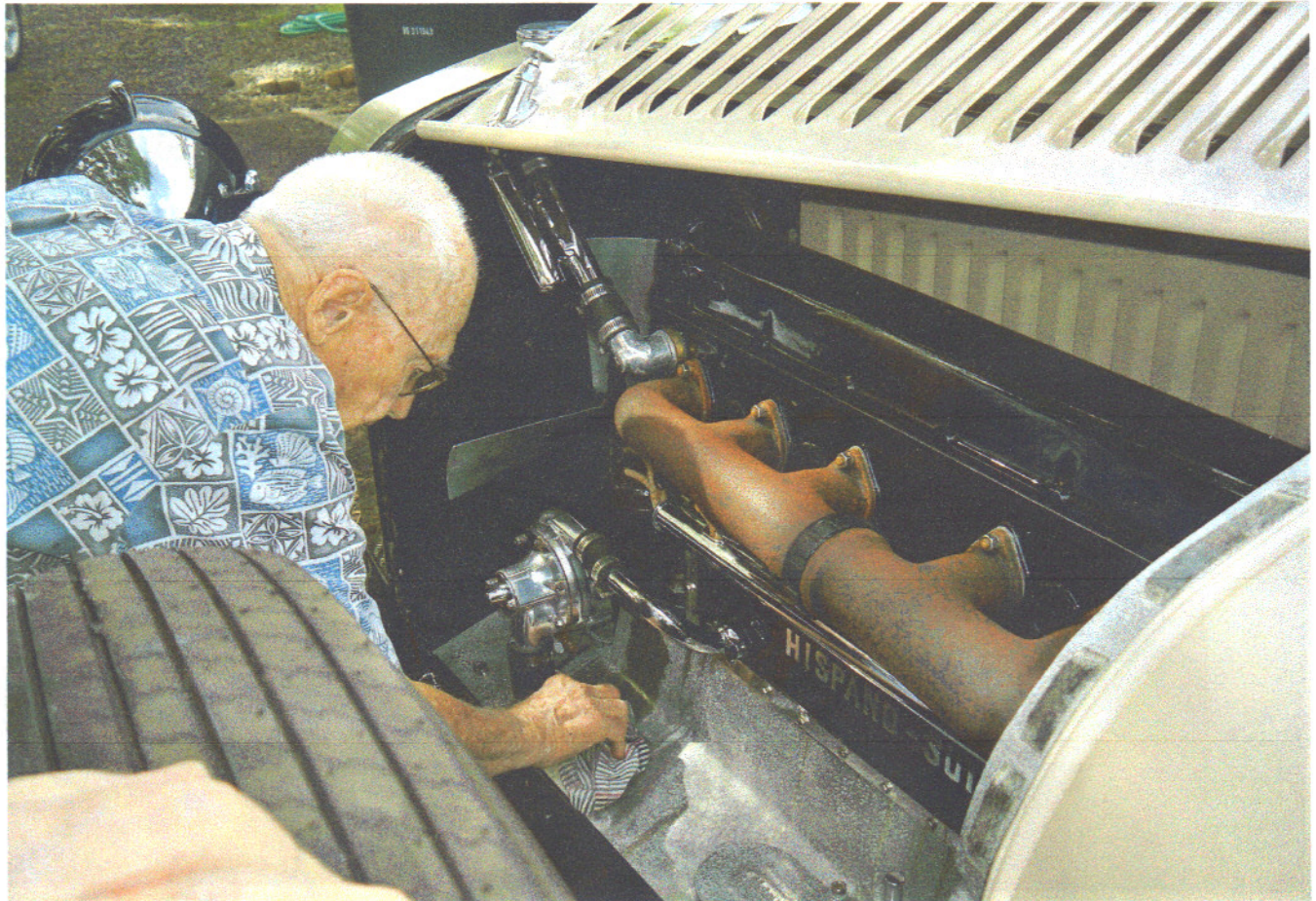
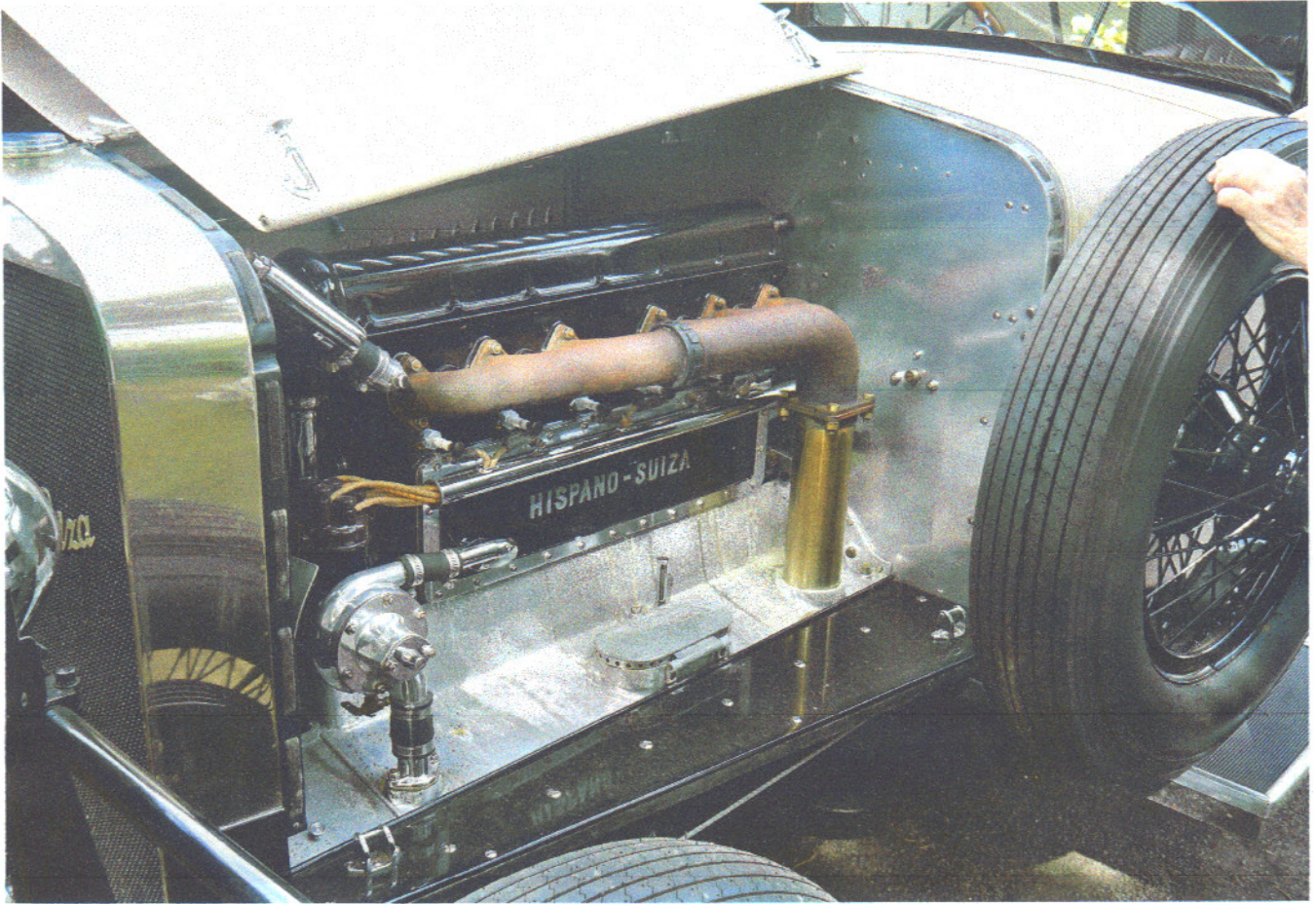

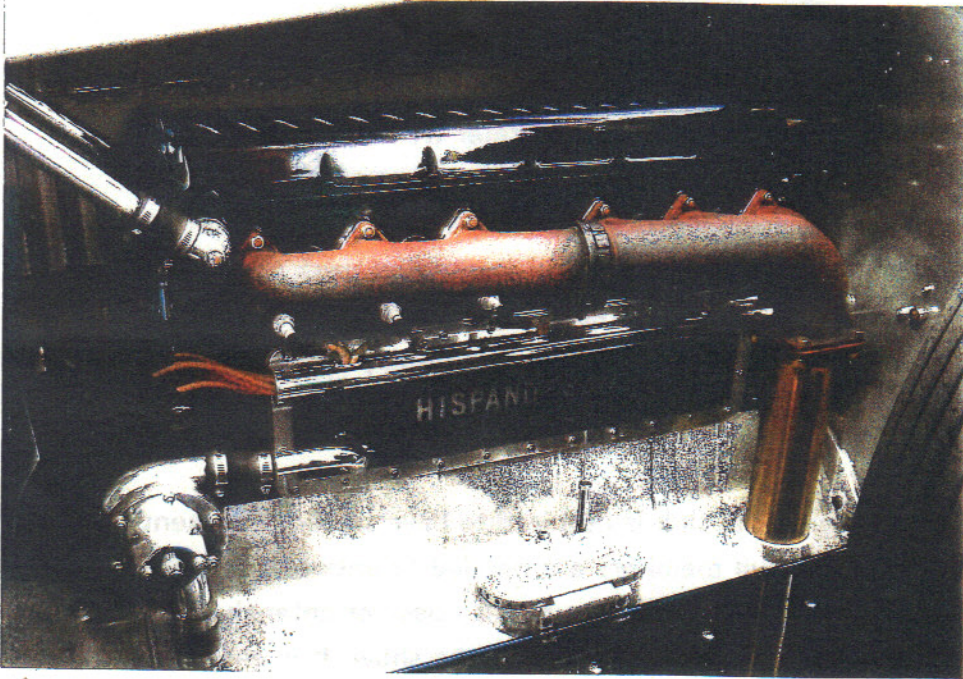

ALOHA REGION INVITED TO THE 2011

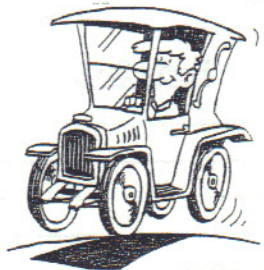
FIRST HAWAIIAN AUTO SHOW

GREAT NEWS: The *Aloha Region* has been invited back to the *First Hawaiian Auto Show*. The show is March 18-20, Friday-Sunday—mark your calendars! This show is a great opportunity for club members to share their antique cars with the general public and to promote the *Aloha Region*. This is one of our “big events” for the year and it has led to new members joining the club. Since the economy is somewhat better, more new car dealers bought space, so we were lucky to be able to get space. Several local car clubs were not invited back this year, but we were able to secure over 2,500 sq. ft. on the main show floor. (See show map).

The club needs roughly 12 antique cars to display at the show. The show organizers, *Motor Trend* and the *Hawaii Automobile Dealers Association*, would prefer we have different cars displayed each year—with a preference towards older cars. The show cars need to be in (at least) very good condition and hopefully unusual and/or historically significant. They do not need to be running/driving cars because we should have at least one tow truck and trailer available. Show set-up will likely be after 12:00pm on Wednesday, March 16, and the cars need to be removed after 9:00pm on Sunday. If you are interested in displaying your antique car at the show, please call Fred at 254-0392 or Victor at 262-7117. (Also see the *Important Auto Show Requirements*)

We also need members to work at the show. The club is required to have someone present on the show floor every hour of the show. Club members are needed to answer questions about the cars, promote the club, and to make sure that the public does not enter the club space. Last year several members “worked” nearly every hour of the show. It is easy and fun—please come to the show and stay for a few hours.

Note: All club members can enter the show for free by going to the special exhibitor’s kiosk in the front and stating their name and club affiliation. We should also have some extra tickets for friends—during the show call Fred at 354-4644.



Important Auto Show Requirements:

- While on display, all show vehicles must have the positive battery cable disconnected and taped using UL approved plastic electrical tape.
- Failure to comply with directions from Show Management will lead to removal of vehicles from the show.
- Proof of insurance (as stated in the Feature Space Contract) or pre-approved by show management waiver must be provided to the show office upon move in.
- A display representative should be present during all public show hours, if possible.
- The vehicle gas level cannot exceed one-eighth (1/8) of a tank. All vehicles will be checked as they enter the convention center by security. They are very strict.
- If the gas cap can be opened from the outside of your vehicle, the vehicle must either have a locking gas cap or the cap must be taped. If the gas cap door can be locked from inside your car, then a locking gas cap is not necessary, but the standard inside gas cap must be taped.
- Please provide your own oil drip pans, if necessary.
- Cars using AC/DC converters must have the security system fuse disconnected to prevent the alarm from being accidentally set-off.
- Needed in advance, please provide a list of participant names so they may gain admittance into the auto show for free during all show hours.

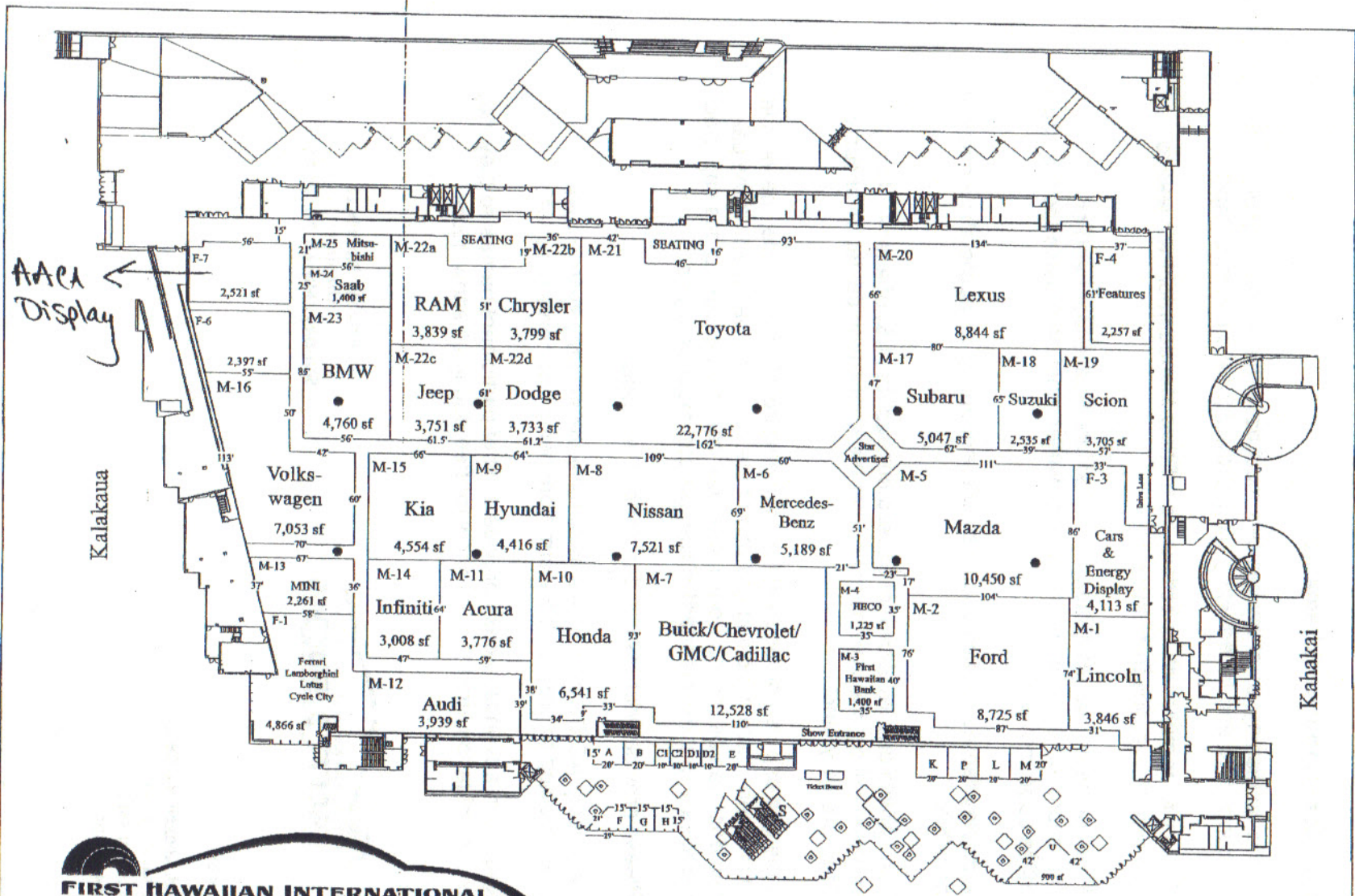
